
As Musicians

This half term we will focus on:

Identify and classify animals and simple food chains.

Develop their understanding of how different habitats locally and around the world provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and how these habitats can be threatened.

Explain how jobs may be different in other locations.

Explain how an area may be spoilt or improved and give reasons.

As Writers

The children will:

Base their piece of writing around the animal stories they explore from different parts of the world. Some of the genres of writing will include: Information texts, descriptions and recounts.

In Reading the children will continue their daily guided reading, spelling, punctuation and grammar sessions.
