As mathematicians we will:

- -Order and compare decimals.
- -Round decimals.
- -Understand percentages.
- -Find the perimeter and area of shapes.
- -Read and interpret and draw our own line graphs.
- -Read and interpret tables and timetables.

As scientists we will:

- -Understand that some materials dissolve in liquid to form a solution and how to recover a substance.
- -Understand how we can separate mixtures including through filtering, sieving and evaporating.
- -Investigate reversible and irreversible changes.
- -Understand that some changes result in the formation of new materials, and that this kind of change is not usually reversible.

As theologians we will:

-Think about how significant it is for Christians to believe God intended Jesus to die?

As artists we will:

- -Research Greek pottery and use our observational skills to examine these.
- -Sketch designs and patterns from our research.
- -Create our own Greek inspired pot.

As French speakers we will:

- -Understand and name some items of French clothing.
- -Describe clothes using adjectives of colour.
- -Describe clothes using other adjectives.
- -Understand a detailed description of a fancy dress outfit.
- -Design and describe a sports kit.
